Thank you to everyone who was able to attend parents' evening sessions this week. Mrs Curran has sent out some information regarding Maths and mastery, which you should all have received. We are fortunate to have a wealth of experience on the teaching staff at Radnage and I am confident that our teachers are best placed to answer your questions. Should you feel your concern is beyond the class teacher or of a safeguarding/child protection nature, then you can speak to me. I am best contacted through the school office, or in morning on the gate. During my first six weeks as Head Teacher I have been impressed at the dedication and commitment the teachers show to the children in their care at this school.

I have received further complaints from our neighbours on Green Lane about parents parking over drive ways. The neighbour has passed on the registration plate, which I have reported to the local PCSO.

As of Monday 16th October the 'Continued Interest List' aka 'waiting list' for the school is now held by Buckinghamshire County Council admissions team. If prospective parents ask you about places we have in different year groups, please refer them to the links on the school's website to the BCC admissions pages as the school no longer handles its own waiting lists.

At the last PTA meeting those present agreed to the school spending £8,000 of PTA funds on several projects for the children. To keep everyone up-to-date on the expenditure we will be having new playground markings installed in bright and colourful thermoplastic to include a 5-a-side football pitch, hexagon hopscotch, I-100 number grid, compass clock, adventure trail and road track layout. I have also ordered new chairs and tables for Otters and Badgers as well as a new interactive whiteboard for this class as the current one hasn't been working properly for a while. So, plans are well under way! I will let you know any other projects that we have completed using the PTA funds as I believe it is important that you know where the fundraising cash goes and the positive impact it has on every child's education and well-being. As I write this newsletter over the half-term holiday, Mrs Wilson's class are having a new interactive whiteboard fitted! This will make a great difference to their learning opportunities in Otters and Hedgehogs.

Children in Year 3 and 4 had a wonderful Egyptian Day (photos on the next page). Thank you for the effort parents went to for costumes. The children enjoyed the Egyptian feast and learning the Sand Dance! Thanks to Mrs Curran for making this a memorable day for all.
