
Our 'Meet the Teacher' sessions will start next week and are an excellent opportunity to find out about the day to day routines that provide the structure for children's learning.

### Start and end of day arrangements

School starts at 8:50 am. The green gates to the playground are opened by a member of staff at 8:40 am each morning. Children and families can then wait on the playground. Older children may be left in the supervision of staff on duty.

At 8:50 am a whistle will be blown for the children to stand still. A second whistle will then be blown for the children to line up on the field end of the playground.

Children are then taken into school.

The green gates are locked by 9:00 am. Children arriving after 9:00 am are late and should be brought to the school office.

At 3:10 pm the green gates are unlocked by a member of staff and parents collecting pupils may assemble at the road end of the playground. Children will be dismissed by a member of staff at 3:20pm. Please do not allow children to scoot or cycle on the playground as this is dangerous to little siblings and grown-ups too. Also, children should not go on the wooden apparatus at these times.

#### Keeping in touch & Sickness

Mrs Willcocks works Monday and Tuesday and Mrs Cronin works Tuesday to Friday in the school office. If your child is too unwell to attend school, please may we remind you to call the office and leave a message or send an email before 8:30 am on the first day of absence.

At this time of year, please may we remind you that if a child is sick, actually vomits, or has diarrhoea, that they cannot return to school until 48 hours after the last bout of sickness. Children sent to school having been sick will be sent home. This reduces the risk of the illness passing to other children. Thank you
