


This activity goes with...

Why do all the worries look different in the story?

Why do you think Ruby's worry is yellow, but the boy's is blue?

How might a worry make you feel?

Do you think adults/everyone have worries sometimes?

What happened when Ruby talked about her worry?

What made Ruby's worry shrink?

Everyone has worries sometimes and that is normal. Ignoring our worries can sometimes make them worse. The best thing to do is talk to someone about what is worrying you.
